

Desktop Or Notebook?

When buying a computer do I purchase a desktop PC or a laptop? This will depend on your needs and your budget.

A desktop PC is one that is placed in a fixed position, typically on a desk in your office or bedroom. It will come with separate parts — a tower or computer that sits flatter on your desk. It contains the main working components of the PC as well as the DVD drive. Additionally you will need a monitor, keyboard and mouse.

A laptop (or notebook) is an all-in-one device that is portable. You carry this with you from room to room, between home and work. Laptops have a built -in monitor, built-in keyboard and built-in mouse. Screen sizes are usually around 15". Anything with around 10" with a smaller keyboard is usually deemed a netbook or sometimes called an eeePC.

Speed

Performance of desktops and laptops are more similar than in the past and, in some cases, equal. To get equal speed you usually have to pay more for the laptop.

The main area in which desktop PCs and laptops differ greatly is their ability to play games; laptops tend to be less powerful in this area than desktop PCs.

If you want to buy a computer just so that you can view photos, use the Internet or type up documents and spreadsheets, then a laptop is a good choice.

Specifications

The key specifications to look for when buying a desktop PC or a laptop are the CPU, RAM (memory), graphics adapter and hard drive.

The CPU is the brains; the RAM is where all your programs will be loaded (the more RAM you have, the more programs you can load); a dedicated or separate the graphics card is always better than one that uses the RAM to help it display graphics.

Cheaper laptops often have lower specifications than desktop PCs, perhaps with less RAM and a smaller hard drive and less powerful graphics adapter.

The CPU makes a big difference in performance. Look for Intel's Core i3, Core i5 or Core i7 CPUs, or AMD's Phenom II CPUs. Some retailers are still selling older processors, which often look impressive price wise but may be much less efficient.

Screen size

When buying a laptop, what size screen will be suitable for your needs. A 15in (measured diagonally) screen is heavy, but you will be able to view a lot more programs on the screen at once, A 14.1in screen is a good balance.

A desktop PC, could easily use a 22in widescreen monitor or higher.

MORE HINTS & TIPS



Burning CDs and DVDs

Most desktop PCs and laptops come with a DVD burner. Smaller 10" Netbooks do not and rely mainly on using internet and USB drives, although you can buy plug in external drives.

Do new laptops and desktop PCs come with software?

Most laptops and desktop PCs come with Microsoft Windows 7 preinstalled. Some older ones may still have XP, although this would generally be "run out" stock.

Some come with "freebies" but many come with 30 day trials for Microsoft Office and Antivirus Software.

Why buy a laptop?

If you want a computer that to use at home, take to work, or want more freedom to roam you will probably need a laptop. A fully charged laptop can give you a few hours of use.

Why buy a desktop PC?

If you want a computer that can store a large amount of music files or photos or you play serious games, then a desktop PC may be for you. A powerful desktop PC often is less expensive than a powerful notebook. Desktops also may be more easily expanded if your needs change.
